Borris in Ossory Community Development Association/Tidy Towns


Borris-in-Ossory Community Development Association (CDA)/Tidy Towns has had an active presence in the village for over 20 years. The group is made up of volunteers and a committee, elected at our AGM every year who meet at least once per month. Our main activities are overseeing the upkeep of public spaces in Borris-in-Ossory such as Main Street, green spaces, flowerbeds, hanging baskets and the cutting of grass in housing estates. We are also responsible for managing a number of Community Employment (CE) participants in the village who carry out this work on a daily basis.

The other role of BIO CDA is co-ordinating the overall development of local community and voluntary projects in the village. In 2017 we decided that our group would apply for funding from Laois Partnership under the Leader/RDP programme. The first step in the process is the development of a '5 year plan' for the village. A sub-committee was formed to carry out a needs assessment of residents in the village and we organised a number of public meetings on this issue. We also appointed a consultant to draw up a 5 year plan and he recently started work in the village.

A combination of regular meetings, teamwork, dropping leaflets to keep residents informed and co-operation between different community and voluntary groups in the village are just some of the reasons why we have been successful in 2018 and we are hoping to improve on this success in 2019. This would not be possible without the hard work and tireless efforts of the many volunteers in Borris-in-Ossory who give up their time to undertake this valuable work on behalf of the community.

Community Water Development Fund 2019

The Local Authority Waters Programme are pleased to announce the launch of an open call for applications to a Community Water Development Fund 2019. Closing date for receipt of applications is Tuesday 12th February 2019 at 7.00pm.

The Community Water Development Fund aims to support communities in progressing water related projects and initiatives, delivering benefits locally whilst also helping to meet the objectives of the River Basin Management Plan for Ireland and the wider EU Water Framework Directive. This fund is open to all community and voluntary groups to assist in the protection and management of water quality, both locally and in the wider catchment. This can include the development of a catchment partnership or River/Lake Trust, and delivery of local projects to protect and improve water quality in a local waterbody. This fund will enable communities to get more involved in the management of their local water environment, delivering multiple benefits for present and future generations. The fund is administered by the Local Authority Waters Programme on behalf of the Department of Housing, Planning and Local Government.

Types of projects considered will include:

- Capital projects such as restoration/habitat conservation/natural flood mitigation measures.
- Projects that promote public awareness/education and events such as biodiversity days, surveys, training workshops, surveys and plans, etc.
- General amenity such as beach clean, improving amenity areas, bird watching facilities, etc.

Grants awarded will range from up to €5,000; up to €10,000 and up to €25,000. The fund is capped at €180,000 for 2019.
