BIKE TOUR WITH LAOIS ARCHAEOLOGY

Active travel like cycling is a great way to fully enjoy what nature has to offer. Laois PPN members were treated to a fantastic bike ride taking in many heritage sites along the way. The tour was led by Laois Archaeologist Sean Murray.

As part of our Climate Action Project for 2023 Laois PPN hope to inspire our members through events like this that showcase the small positive actions they can take, such as active travel, whilst celebrating our wonderful county."

Seán Murray, said of the event "There is no better way to explore our heritage, than on the leisurely pace of a bike. We cycled along the canal, which was completed in 1791, as a sustainable form of transport, and got to stop off at the Grattan Aqueduct, named after Henry Grattan who donated

some of his Moyanna Estate for its construction by the Grand Canal Company. We then cycled to Bellegrove House, a 19th Century mansion which was owned by the infamous John George Adair, a business tycoon and progressive farmer, who was not fondly remembered by small farm holders, of whom he evicted many throughout Ireland. Bellegrove was accidentally burnt to the ground in 1887, two years after the death of "Blackjack". His widowed wife Cornelia, built the lavish Church of the Accension at Rathadaire in his honour, which was designed by the emanant Irish Architect James Franklin Fuller, and with thanks to the kind Reverend Ven Leslie Stevenson we got to see the interior and superb stained-glass windows inside. At Ballyadding we visited the Medieval Church ruin and the reputed grave of an O'Dempsey Highwayman, the notorious Cahir na gCapall, who was hung in Maryborough Gaol in 1735. With our tummies rumbling, we were glad to arrive at the Fisherman's thatched Inn, where we were refreshed for the return journey to Vicarstown along the Blueway.

Laois PPN provide regular updates to PPN Member Groups on funding opportunities. Community Groups registered with Laois PPN were invited to come along and learn how their Group and local community can benefit from this funding opportunity.

As Ireland moves towards a low-carbon economy, Fáilte Ireland will deliver the Regenerative Tourism Scheme as part of the EU Just Transition Fund. Through this scheme, tourism projects will be funded across Laois and the Midlands – sustaining jobs, businesses and communities.

Dan Bergin, Laois PPN Resource Worker said, "Laois with its central location, beautiful Slieve Mountains, rich heritage and growing number of events and festivals is ideally placed to benefit from this funding opportunity".

Project ideas Potential include Community Festivals, Community Markets, development of walkways trails and local in communities, small museums or visitor centres, Community Café, Equipment hire such as kayaks bicycles and or glamping/camping facilities.

Attendees at the workshop were treated to sweet treats from local Artisan award winning bakery, Mueller & O'Connell.





Regina Dunne, the new Tourism Development Executive with Laois Chamber Alliance said " I was delighted to be invited by the Laois PPN to deliver a presentation on the €68 million of Just Transition Regenerative Tourism



funding. There was a great turnout of Laois PPN groups on Tuesday evening last at The Cube Low Carbon Centre of Excellence. It was evident from the discussion and the people in the room that communities are key to enhancing our tourism offering here in County Laois. The purpose of the workshop was to generate project ideas that could potentially be funded under the funding which will be

administered by Fáilte Ireland. Ideas such as the repurposing of old farm building to create low carbon accommodation offerings or employment for community cafés were discussed. We invite anyone with a project idea to fill out the attached survey, and make an anonymous submission to Fáilte Ireland. Regenerative tourism, is key to job creation in the counties affected by the closure of the peat processing power plants, and Laois are strategically located in the country for tourists to situate themselves to explore all of Ireland while on their visits to Ireland.

Dan Bergin, Laois PPN Resource Worker said, "The Community Climate Action Funding Workshop was part of our Climate Action Project for 2023. The funding available will support PPN Member Groups with Climate Action Projects in their community."

A fund of €465,000 over the next 18 months from the Department of the Environment, Climate and Communications is available to support Community Groups in Laois in building low carbon, sustainable communities. There will be a further €465,000- available to groups in Laois over the following 18 months.

Projects can address ideally more than one of the following 5 themes:

- 1.Home/Energy
- 2.Travel
- 3. Food and Waste
- 4. Shopping and Recycling
- 5. Local Climate and Environmental Action

There are 3 project scales as shown below

Small Scale – Up to €20,000 **Medium Scale** – Up to €50,000 **Large Scale** – Up to €100,00

NEW HOUSING FOR LAOIS



Minister for Housing, Darragh O'Brien TD, visited Laois for the official opening of 4 social housing schemes on Monday 15th of May. These homes were located across all 3 Municipal Districts and will provide 108 new homes for families across Laois.

The official opening took place in the presence of Cathaoirleach of Laois County Council, Cllr. Thomasina Connell, Chief Executive John Mulholland and elected representatives and guests.





These four new housing developments are located in Ballylinan, Ballyroan, Durrow and Portlaoise. The houses were constructed both directly by Laois County Council and by AHB's supported by the Council.

On Tuesday 23rd May, Laois PPN's Dan Bergin was delighted to attend the opening of the Irish Wheelchair Association Portlaoise Accessible Gym.

The additions to the gym include 6 pieces of training equipment which are; a rowing machine, a motomed, an easy stand glider, a handcycling machine, a multipurpose weight machine and 2 sets of dumbbell free weights ranging from 1kg – 10kg. All of these provide the users with the necessary tools to complete a full body workout.

Visitors were given an insight as to what IWA users can experience on a day-to-day basis and what sort of atmosphere is present in the centre.
