### **BIODIVERSITY WALK IN PORTLAOISE**



On a warm Tuesday evening, Laois PPN in collaboration with Portlaoise Tidy Towns, held a Biodiversity Walk in Portlaoise. The walk was led by Ecologist Dr Fiona MacGowan.

Fiona MacGowan along with Brian Gaynor, of Green Pine Consultants, were commissioned by Portlaoise Tidy Towns to undertake their recently launched new Biodiversity Action Plan 2023 - 2028.

The Biodiversity Walk highlighted the many positive steps taken to enhance biodiversity in Portlaoise started at the Top Square rambled around the many biodiversity areas in Portlaoise finishing up in Fitzmaurice Place.

Vincent Booth, the Secretary of Portlaoise Tidy
Towns and Laois PPN Secretariat said of the tour,
"It was great to see such a good turnout for our
biodiversity walk. I'd like to thank Dr. Fiona
MacGowan for giving of her time and giving such
an informative talk. It's so nice to know we have such a variety
of biodiversity on our doorstep. I suppose the main message that
people can take away from the evening is that everyone can do

their bit for the environment no matter how small the action."



volunteers all over Ireland. Also, many thanks to Laois PPN and Laois County Council for enthusiastically supporting the BAP. The Biodiversity Crisis is daunting and we can feel powerless but so much can be achieved when we work together as evidenced by the changes made across Portlaoise town for the benefit of biodiversity e.g. changed grass-mowing regimes resulting in natural wildflower meadows such as that in the People's Park; biodiversity awareness-raising signs along the outer ring road; greening the grey with pollinator-friendly planting at many roundabouts; pollinator-friendly crocus bulb planting along several access roads to the town, thousands of native trees planted across the town and many more! We had a great wander around Portlaoise town on Tuesday evening catching the highlights of the many biodiversity actions of Portlaoise TidyTowns. We got to watch the aerial acrobatics of some of the town's avian residents - swifts, swallows, and house martins and to hear some of the amazing facts about their lives. We studied the beautiful native Irish wildflowers that grow on the esker that is the town's historic Ridge graveyard such as the gorgeous Greater knapweed, the delicate wild carrot, the beautiful mauve Field scabious and the hay scented Lady's bedstraw. We also discussed how much more sustainable it is to use perennial, pollinator-friendly plants in the planting schemes compared to the pollinatorunfriendly annuals of old planting plans - less time and less costs involved for all. We chatted about the great help and ideas available at www.pollinators.ie and all went home with some terrific nature swatches from the national Biodiversity **Data Centre courtesy of Laois PPN.**



Census 2022 Summary Results



The Central Statistics Office has published the Census 2022 Summary Results. These provide high level data on all areas of Census 2022. The results show that the population of Ireland increased to 5,149,139 (+8%) between 2016 and 2022.

Looking at the results of Census 2022, it shows that the population of Laois grew by 8% to 91,877, which means the number of people in the county rose by 7,180 between April 2016 and April 2022. Over the same period, Ireland's population grew by 8% from 4,761,865 to 5,149,139."

#### 2023 LGBTI+ Community Services Funding Call



Laois PPN are delighted with the announcement that €900,000 is being made available to applicant groups, operating at national, regional and local level, to support community services and promote visibility and inclusion of LGBTI+ people.

Funding aims to promote inclusion, protect rights and to improve quality of life and wellbeing for LGBTI+ people in Ireland.

Grant scheme is open to applications from existing LGBTI+ non-government organisations and community organisations working with LGBTI+ people.

The 2023 LGBTI+ Community Services Funding Call is an important element in supporting the implementation of the National LGBTI+ Inclusion Strategy, which was published on 28 November 2019, and complements the National LGBTI+ Youth Strategy published in June 2018.

There are two streams of funding;

Scheme A will support new initiatives but is also open to applications from existing LGBTI+ NGOs for funding to maintain and enhance existing services and initiatives. This will assist these organisations build capacity and maintain existing and well-established LGBTI+ supports.

Scheme B will provide small grants to organisations for projects that promote visibility and inclusion of LGBTI+ persons.

All applications must be submitted electronically. Closing Date: 12pm on Wednesday 26 July 2023.

## **COMHAIRLE NA NÓG**



Comhairle na nÓg are child and youth councils located in counties all around Ireland. Laois Comhairle na nÓg aims to empower the youth in the County to voice local issues faced by people their age. Laois PPN's Dan Bergin sits on the Laois Comhairle na nÓg Steering Committee.

Anyone between the ages of twelve to eighteen are welcome to join the group. In order to give students the opportunity to understand what they could achieve with Laois Comhairle na nÓg, an AGM is held every year and students from secondary schools all over Laois are invited to attend. Every year at this AGM a new topic is voted on, this topic is always something that is currently affecting the young people of Laois. The members of Laois Comhairle na nÓg then work on achieving positive change based on the chosen topic in it's weekly meetings.



Last year the group organized a colour fun run with the aim of raising awareness for mental health. Over five hundred people joined in on the day in Vicarstown. Currently, the group are working on the topic of discrimination, as voted for by young people at the AGM last November. After coming up with the idea to create a podcast, the members of Laois Comhairle na nÓg have been working hard to bring it's vision to life. The aim is to educate people in Laois about the different types of discrimination that people are facing in our local area and hope that by shining a light on the topic, people may learn where they can find help.
